Brothers and Sisters in our Lord Jesus:

B *What is below are a few paragraphs of the sermon which I delivered at the spring pastors' conference a couple of weeks back at Olympia Village in Oconomowoc. The text is Ephesians 4:1-7. The complete sermon is on the SWD website (www.swd.lcms.org) in the president's blog [for April 2010].*

One is about wholeness, the kind of wholeness that is lacking in this world because of sin. Ever since Adam and Eve rebelled against God in the Garden of Eden, suspicion and resentment have separated people. Cain and Abel were separated first by jealousy and then hatred. Different languages separate people at the Tower of Babel because they were in rebellion against God. The root cause of all those barriers in one way or another is sin. Sin not only isolates us from God. Sin builds walls around us so that we are isolated from and estranged to others.

It's supposed to be different than that in the church, or so we think. Sometime we long for the good old days when there was more peace, more unity, and more harmony. There was a time when that did exist. In his 1923 Synodical Address Friedrich Pfothenauer writes, "Our Synod has so far been preserved from party spirit..." He writes, "It would be unheard of within our Synod to speak of a liberal party in opposition to a conservative party. We are all joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. One and the same spirit prevails in all our district conventions and in all our educational institutions."

Oh, for the good old days! These days there seems to be more discord than unity, more disagreement than concord, more splintered relationships than harmony. We know why that is. It's because of sin. Because of my sin, because of your sin, because of our sin. We know how sin affects our relationships even as we gather together as brothers within the church. Pfothenauer helps us understand: "No matter where it appears in the Church, party spirit is a sign of serious danger. If it is not overcome, it will without fail ruin the Church. Invariably church parties are a fatal poison. They are incompatible with the real character of the Church."

These days there seems to be more discord than unity . . .

How true. And yet we see so much of it in our relationship today. And whose fault is it? It is because of my sin, because of your sin, because of our sin. It is for such sins that the Gospel words of forgiveness because of the suffering and dying of our Lord Jesus are so powerful. St. Paul writes, "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace." Grace so powerful that God loves sinners such as us. Grace so amazing that our Lord brings us together, united into the church to be his people.

Consider the great blessings which our Lord showers upon us. Consider the wonderful blessings which we share together in the church because of God's grace. Listen to the words of Paul: "There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call— one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."

Hence, we don't need to reflect the society in which we live that feeds on its conflict. We are not Republicans. We are not Democrats. We are the people of God. We are the people whom our Lord has called to be his people here and now. We are the people whom God has placed in this time for expressed purpose of being His people here and now. It is time for us to be the people God has called us to be, time to be the people who have been redeemed by the blood of Christ, time for us, as St. Paul says, to "Walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

May our Lord grant us His peace!

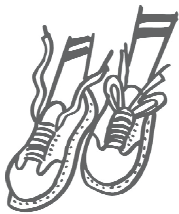
Share the Warmth of Jesus

Imagine what it would be like for your family to huddle under one thin blanket or sheet on the floor of a refugee camp on a cold night. For countless refugees and the poor around the world, that's exactly what occurs each night. The cold and suffering so many experience can be lessened by those of us blessed with a warm bed and ample blankets.

Jesus instructs us in Matthew 25: 31-46 to share our gifts with those who are hungry, lonely and cold. One of the ways you can serve as the Lord's hands is to join in helping to assemble quilts for Orphan Grain Train this summer. Orphan Grain Train informs us that of the many needs within the U S and around the world, one of the greatest unmet needs is for blankets and quilts.

The first summer work days for assembling quilts are scheduled for Wednesday, June 9 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Thursday, June 10 from 9 a.m. to noon. At noon join fellow workers for a salad luncheon. Homemade rolls, cookies and beverages are served throughout the day. In addition to serving our Lord, we have a wonderful opportunity for fellowship with old friends and making new ones. The only skill needed: pull a needle and thread through three layers of fabric and tie a knot. Coming for an hour or two, or staying for the full work day are options. Bring a friend and stay for the noon luncheon provided for the group. What great joy to see how large and small scraps of fabric can be turned into colorful and warm quilts, and to know you had a part in bringing warmth to a family in desperate need of a blanket.

Orphan Grain Train is also in need of children's and men's clothing as well as blankets. The next ingathering for OGT is Saturday, June 5, from 8 to 11a in Fellowship Hall.

Wrap smaller items in the wash cloth; wrap the wash cloth and remaining items in the towel and tie with ribbon or yarn.

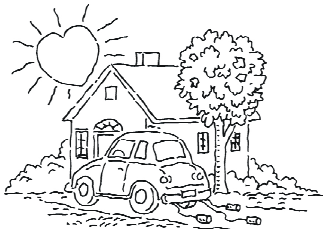
Each and every school item, shoes, backpack or Health Kit will be greatly appreciated by someone in need. Thank you for your care and help.

Pommerntag is the German word for Pomeranian Day. It is a day of celebration for those of Pomeranian heritage, their families and friends. If your ancestors settled in Wisconsin or one of the nearby states in the last half of the nineteenth century and were Lutheran, you most likely have Pomeranian blood in your veins. And if your last name ends in one of these suffixes, you more than likely have Pomeranian ancestry: -KE; -IN or -LIN; -OW; -ITZ; -EL or ELL; -IG; -AU; -EN or -UN. (Note: Pastor Garchow is Pomeranian.)

Many of the members of the *Pommerscher Verein Freistadt*, sponsor of Pommerntag, belong to our sister congregation, Trinity in Freistadt, Town of Mequon. For more information, see the web site

St. Paul's Lutheran congregation began in 1863 with a group of immigrants primarily from Pomerania.

Pomerania no longer exists today, but covered the area of what is now northeastern Germany and northwestern Poland.
