Call me when there has been a death in your family or among your acquaintances. Call me when your marriage is going through a rough patch. Call me when a friend or coworker needs a visit from a pastor. Call me when you are thinking about a divorce. Call me when someone you know becomes a Christian and may be looking for a church. Call me when you are thinking about suicide. Call me when someone you know needs to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ – we'll both pay a visit to them.
